TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JULY 2013

The trustees, who are also directors for the purpose of company law, have pleasure in presenting their report and the audited financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 July 2013.

Reference and administrative details are shown in the schedule of members of the board and professional advisers on page 1 of the financial statements.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

The charity is constituted as a company limited by guarantee and governed by its memorandum and articles of association.

The Trustees shall number not less than 12 or more than 30. The Board comprises all of the Principal Officers, 3 Ordinary Trustees and 4 External Trustees. The maximum and minimum number of the Council Members can be varied by the company in a general meeting.

At each Annual General Meeting the Ordinary Trustees and Principal Officers for the time being shall retire from office but shall be eligible for re-election for a further year, provided that no Principal Officer may hold office for longer than 2 Academic Years. The GSA is a member-run organisation, with annual elections dependent on the timings of the University of York's intake of Postgraduate students (the GSA's membership). The Principal Officers shall be entitled to attend and speak at General Meetings of the Company at meetings of the Association Council and the Board of Trustees. External Trustees serve for a term of three years from their date of appointment and may serve a maximum of two terms.

As a member run organisation, the GSA council, which is run by the members forms the policy making body of the organisation. The Principal Officers of the organisation sit on council as well as the Board of Trustees.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The objectives of the charity are:

To promote and defend the educational and general interest of the members and be the recognised representative channel between them, the University and other external bodies; further the social interests of the members to promote the integration and social cohesion of members and non-members.

Improve communication between graduates and undergraduates at the University by working in conjunction with representative bodies of undergraduate students.

Establish contact with other graduate student bodies and facilitate the exchange of students and best practice between institutions.

Raise the profile of postgraduate study at the University thereby supporting the advancement of education.

Provide academic and welfare related services to members and non-members.

Provide opportunities for all postgraduate students of the University to participate in sporting or social activities.

Further such policies of the company as are from time to time determined by the members in accordance with the articles, and to provide any other services as considered necessary in pursuit of these objects.

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives, and in planning future activities.

ACTIVITES AND PERFORMANCE

The GSA has had a developmental year, working with its membership to ensure that services are relevant and in keeping with the needs, and the needs of our host institution, and funders, The University of York. The Association has spent considerable time working on its core purpose, the representation of the postgraduate community, through support structures for the Office bearers as well as further developing department based representational structures. Internally, the Association has had a number of contested elections throughout the year, leading a higher than normal turnover of principal officers, but also the election of a vibrant and enthusiastic council which have been valuable to ensure that the membership's views are at the forefront of the principal officers thinking. Throughout the year, the Association has been guided by its trustee board. Our chair, Ian Pain, was re-appointed for a second (three year) term of office ensuring continuity and expertise is retained.

The elected officers have been working hard to ensure that our host institution remains aware of the needs and views of the membership, through active engagement in University committees, working groups and panels. The GSA has also been working with the City of York Council to ensure that the specific needs of the postgraduate community are considered by the city.

The GSA has invested in its Academic and Welfare casework provision through the purchase of new casework software designed to improve record keeping, measurement of trends, and ultimately ensure that the GSA is more efficient in its use of resources. The Advice and Welfare function has also seen a change in personnel, with Kay Mitchell leaving the association mid-way through the year, and being replaced by Ruth Walton. Ruth comes from a strong casework background and has fitted well into the organisation.

The Association has also had a successful social program for 2012/13, building on the experiences of previous years to good effect not only in terms of increasing engagement in this part of the organisation but to more actively engage the participants in shaping future social programs. Therefore there has been significant progress in the development of feedback mechanisms.

2013/14 will be a defining time for the GSA, as it embarks on the development of a new strategic plan, encompassing all areas of the association, as well as further developing an evidence based approach towards assessing its activities.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financially, the Association has had a solid year, turning round a budgeted deficit (as noted in 2011/12). Although the non – grant income is slightly down on 2011/12, this is within the parameters set by the Board of Trustees. 2012/13 represents the second year that the GSA has had external accountants, and the benefits are obvious to the management and trustees of this arrangement.

RESPONSIBLITIES OF THE TRUSTEES

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the trustees have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law).

The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the and of the incoming resources and application of resources, including the income and expenditure, of the charity for the year.

In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently:
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP
- make judgement and estimates that are reasonable and prudent
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and which enables them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

UNIVERSITY OF YORK GRADUATE STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION

We have audited the financial statements of University of York Students' Graduates Association for the year ended 31 July 2013 which comprise the primary statements including the Statement of Financial Activities, the Balance Sheet and the related notes. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice applicable to Smaller Entities).

This report is made solely to the charitable company's members, as a body, in accordance with Chapter 3 of Part 16 of the Companies Act 2006. Respective responsibilities of trustees and auditor

As explained more fully in the Trustees' Responsibilities Statement, the trustees (who are also the directors of the charitable company for the purposes of company law) are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements and for being satisfied that they give a true and fair view.

Our responsibility is to audit and express an opinion on the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland). Those standards require us to comply with the Auditing Practices Board's (APB's) Ethical Standards for Auditors.

Scope of the audit of the financial statements

An audit involves obtaining evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements sufficient to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or error. This includes an assessment of: whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the charitable company's circumstances and have been consistently applied and adequately disclosed; the reasonableness of significant accounting estimates made by the trustees; and the overall presentation of the financial statements. In addition, we read all the financial and non-financial information in the Trustees' Annual Report to identify material inconsistencies with the audited financial statements. If we become aware of any apparent material misstatements or inconsistencies we consider the implications for our report.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS - 31 JULY 2013

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of the financial statements are set out below. They have been applied consistently during the year.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Companies Act 2006 and the Statement of Recommended Practice - Accounting and Reporting by Charities (issued in March 2005), and the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

Cashflow statement

The trustees have taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 (revised) from including a cash flow statement in the financial statement on the grounds that the company is small.

Incoming resources

Incoming resources are recognised when receivable.

Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised when a liability is incurred or when a constructive obligation exists.

- Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both the direct costs and support costs relating to such activities.
- Governance costs include those costs associated with meeting the constitutional and statutory requirements of the charity and include its audit fees and costs linked to the strategic management of the charity.

Tangible fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated value, over the useful economic life of the asset as follows:
