

By-Law: Motions

This By-Law describes the process and procedures for Motions at the GSA.

1. Introduction

1.1. Interpretation

This By-Law shall be subject at all times to the provisions of the Articles and shall be read in conjunction therewith.

1.2. Alterations of the By-Law

These By-Laws shall be amended from time to time by Association Council by a two-thirds majority.

2. Definition

A motion is an idea to create policy, change policy and create/amend By-Laws

3. Submitting a Motion

A motion should be submitted to Association Council in accordance with the By-Law on Association Council.

4. Format for every motion should be:

- 4.1. Title of motion
- 4.2. What do you want to change?
- 4.3. Why do you want to change it?
- 4.4. What do you want the York Graduate Students' Association to do?

5. Changes to the Memorandum and Articles of Association or By-Laws

If a motion requires a change to the articles or by-laws it must be submitted along with the changes being proposed.

6. Motions of Censure and No Confidence

- 6.1. A Motion of Censure and No Confidence may be submitted against relevant Sabbatical Officers, Part-Time Officers and representatives in their relevant committees and forums.
- 6.2. A Motion of Censure should be used when the actions of the member are unacceptable and should not be repeated. This should be noted in the minutes and published online.
- 6.3. A Motion of No Confidence should be used to remove a member from their position if it is believed the members actions are completely unacceptable. In the event of the motion being passed the member shall no longer hold their position.
- 6.4. In the event that a No Confidence motion votes to removes a Sabbatical Officer then a referendum will be called to put the removal to a student vote. The referendum will be conducted in accordance with the By-Law on Referendums.

7. Voting Procedure:

Voting may be by a simple majority or a two-thirds majority as detailed below.

- 7.1. Simple Majority
 - Unless otherwise stated, all motions presented to Council will be carried by a simple majority of those present and eligible to vote.
- 7.2. Two-Thirds Majority
 - If a procedural motion, motion of no-confidence or a motion proposing a change to the By-Laws or Articles is presented, it shall only be carried by a two-thirds majority of those present and eligible to vote.
- 7.3. In the event of a tie, a procedural motion will be triggered to put the motion to a referendum and should that procedural motion fail the substantive motion will also fail.

8. Discussion and Amendments of Motions

This will be conducted in accordance with the By-Law on Association Council.
